COMMUNITY LIFE

Do you support any housing on the Cubberley site? If so, housing for whom?

I would support housing at Cubberley, but my priority is Cubberley moving forward with breaking ground and not being delayed.

I am NOT in favor of housing at Cubberley at all. The site contains much of the last park land available in Palo Alto.

Housing is not a priority for me on Cubberly. While I care deeply about housing and believe in mixed-use, there are other opportunities to build housing in the city. There aren't many opportunities to create large community spaces.

We should prioritize great public space for the entire community.

KEITH RECKDAHL

No, Cubberley needs to have long-term capacity to serve our growing population.

While subsidized housing for teachers and other public workers is a good idea, I believe that Cubberley should be dedicated to serving our growing population, not housing it.

GREER STONE

I do not support the inclusion of housing on the Cubberley site. We have already identified locations for over 6,000 new housing units, which represents a 25% increase to our current housing stock. This significant expansion makes it unnecessary to incorporate housing at Cubberley. Instead, I believe we should focus on utilizing the site for community-centered initiatives that enhance educational, recreational, and social services, ensuring we meet the diverse needs of our residents without further straining our already limited resources. Prioritizing these community functions will provide greater benefits to Palo Alto's residents.
